

B.Sc. (Agriculture/Horticulture) Common Entrance Examination (CET)

1. The Students will become eligible to appear for B.Sc. (Agriculture/Horticulture) Common Entrance Test (CET) after completion of all the pre-requisite programs/courses.
2. For B.Sc. (Agriculture) CET Examination, the candidate has to complete Foundation in Agricultural Sciences OR Diploma in Agriculture (SAU's) and Diploma in Horticulture, Diploma in Agri-business Management and Diploma in Agro-Journalism.
3. For B.Sc. (Horticulture) CET Examination, the candidate has to complete Foundation in Agriculture OR Diploma in Agriculture (SAU's) and Diploma in Fruit Production, Diploma in Vegetable Production and Diploma in Floriculture & Landscape Gardening.
4. **The Common Entrance Test (CET) Examination shall be conducted** in the month of June-July each year for B.Sc.(Agriculture) and B.Sc.(Horticulture) separately.
5. B.Sc.(Agriculture) CET Examination shall include four sections such as (i) Foundation in Agriculture, (ii) Diploma in Horticulture, (iii) Diploma in Agri-business Management (iv) Diploma in Agro-Journalism
6. B.Sc. (Horticulture) CET Examination shall include four sections such as (i) Foundation in Agriculture, (ii) Diploma in Fruit Production, (iii) Diploma in Vegetable Production & (iv) Diploma in Floriculture & Landscape Gardening.
7. **The Common Entrance Test (CET) Examination** pattern shall be Multiple Choice Question (MCQ) type and include total 200 questions, 50 questions from each sections. All questions shall carry equal marks. Students has to secure minimum 100 marks out of 200 marks in the CET Examination.
8. Student has to fill up online CET Admission Form along with **CET Examination Fees** of Rs.500/-. which shall be paid to the University through credit card / debit card / bank challan.
9. All CET passed and selected student shall take Online Admission in the period given in the program prospectus.
